



Job Description

Title: On-Call Advocate

Hours: Evenings/Weekends

Supervisor: Executive Director

Compensation: Shift pay, \$30 - \$40/shift

Position Summary: The On-Call Advocate provides advocacy services to survivors of sexual violence, domestic violence and/or stalking including: 24-hour crisis line support; crisis intervention and response; emergency legal and medical accompaniment; information and referrals; systems navigation; emotional support and on-going support, as needed.

Specific Position Responsibilities:

- Provide after-hours on-call advocacy.
- Respond in-person to requests for emergency advocacy services at medical facilities and law enforcement agencies.
- Provide crisis intervention services including safety planning, emotional support and transportation.
- Answer crisis lines.
- Maintain and track information and activities as required for reporting.
- Participate in debriefing and direct service meetings, as able.
- Adhere to agency policy with regard to confidentiality of client records and information.

Qualifications – Required:

- Commitment to eliminating sexual violence, domestic violence, stalking and all forms of oppression.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Excellent organizational skills and the ability to provide professional community presentations.
- Demonstrated skill in handling multiple tasks, tracking details and setting priority for accomplishing a variety of projects.
- An understanding of maintaining confidentiality when supporting survivors and/or their partners, friends and family.
- Ability to work well with a diverse group of individuals, including staff, volunteers, board members and the general public.
- Ability to work flexible hours independently and with SASS staff as a team member.
- Ability to respond in-person within 30 minutes or less to the local medical facilities and law enforcement agencies.
- Valid driver's license.
